Within the event site there is a Sensory Area available to use throughout the day.

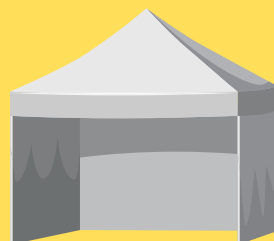

Wheelchair Accessibility

IncludFEST is a wheelchair accessible event. Most of the paths in Hardwick Park are well maintained with a small number of paths muddy at times in wet weather. There are some gentle slopes.
