

ABOUT INCLUDEEST

IncludFEST is a fully inclusive and accessible arts festival for children, young people and families, produced by TIN Arts. It is usually presented as an outdoor event in County Durham and is open to everyone, with a particular focus on welcoming families with a d/Deaf or disabled child.

IncludFEST is completely free to attend to ensure it remains accessible to all. In 2025, the festival was generously supported by Durham County Council with further funding from Durham University's Light Years programme supporting the creation of a new dance work From Pinecones to Galaxies which premiered at IncludFEST.

WHAT HAPPENED IN 2025?

On Saturday 20th September 2025, we hosted IncludFEST at Spennymoor Town Hall. As usual, the festival was originally planned to take place outdoors, but a yellow weather warning meant we had to make a last-minute decision to move indoors.

With just two days to go before the event, our team had to act fast to make the change possible. Our immediate priorities were to communicate the new venue to audiences and providers, adapt the programme for an indoor space, and ensure everything could run safely and smoothly.



We hugely appreciate the flexibility and support shown by our audiences, providers and partners in making this possible.

We are extremely grateful to Spennymoor Town Council, who stepped in to offer the Town Hall as an alternative venue. Without their support, the festival would not have been able to go ahead.

Despite the weather challenges, the day itself was a real success. We welcomed 168 attendees and were delighted to see so many happy, smiling faces throughout the event.



FESTIVAL DELIVERY AND PROGRAMME

The 2025 programme featured a lively mix of **performances**, **interactive workshops**, **and creative drop-in activities**, all designed to celebrate inclusivity and creativity.

Performances and activities included:

We'd like to give special thanks to Unfolding Theatre and Unite Club, who were unfortunately unable to attend due to the weather complications and change in venue. We hope to collaborate again in the future.

We also had BSL Interpretation by Jenna Johnson and Caroline Ryan, technical support from Ingram Sound, compering by Bryn Chaytor Wilson and Aaron Burton, production support by The Geordie Crew, mobile changing facilities by Accessoloo, and production management by Graeme Nixon.

10 dedicated volunteers gave up their time to help make the day as success, for which we are extremely grateful.

A total of **61 people** were involved in delivering IncludFEST 2025, including performers, artists, volunteers, TIN Arts staff members and more. Together, they made IncludFEST 2025 a memorable and inclusive experience for everyone involved.



OUR AUDIENCE

In 2025, 168 people attended IncludFEST, and 31 people completed our postevent survey.

Of those who completed the survey:

- 55% had one or more people in their group who identified
 d/Deaf or disabled
- Audiences joined us from across the North F coming from County Durham

YOUR FEEDBACK

Feedback from audiences was overwhelmingly positive, with many praising the quality of performances, relaxed atmosphere and welcoming volunteers.

Survey results showed that on average:

- Performances were rated 4.84/5
- Workshops were rated 4.6/5
- Drop-in sessions were rated 4.67/5
- Communication about the change in venue was rated 4.59/5
